Silsby - 50's & 60's

- Strange and surprising fabric colors and patterns

War-time - 40's

- Named for the thick outline around their nose

Black Outline - 30's & 40's



- Button eyes, otherwise printed faces

1962

1938 - Georgene Novelties

- Wool or cotton yarn



1934 - 1961

- Fully printed faces
- Pie-cut eyes, large nose
- Mouths are a single line
- Printed heart
- Ann and Andy patterns are identical, including the heart

Molly-E's Doll Outfitters

Molly-E dolls are

un-official bootlegs, but still collected!

Printed-on hearts and identical construction began here, but would become the norm for official dolls!



- Less bluish
- Less prominent tear ducts
- Taller faces

Bicentennials

- 70's

- Acrylic yarn in a bright bright red

70's

- Cotton yarn
- Stuffed tight to burst

- Prominent red dots near the nose, "tear ducts"

- Large smiles

- plastic safety eyes, plastic buttons

60's

Knickerbocker Toy Co. 1963 - 1983



- Lots of bluish



P.F. Volland Company

1961 - 1961

- No elbow seams
- Ann has brown hair

- They use different patterns, Andy has large hands

- Simple face, sometimes hand painted, sometimes printed

- Button eyes


- Cardboard heart hidden under the fabric

- Acrylic hair - Thinner fabric
- plastic eyes

- Dolls matching older descriptions that look too new

- Reproductions (repros) of older doll types, look out for these as a new collector!

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Hasbro Applause Reproductions

- Thinner fabric

- Bigger eyes, still plastic

- First machine washable dolls

Very similar

- No real buttons, either embroidered or fabric

- Lots of costumed special editions!

- Wide smile

- Names embroidered on clothes

- Sometimes embroidered eyes, sometimes buttons

- Embroidered faces and hearts

- Sometimes embroidered eyes, sometimes buttons

Hasbro Applause Toy Company 1990's - 2012



Handmade Dolls

- Full embroidered, added, or hand-painted faces

- Embroidered hearts

- Rick-rack or other trim

- Strange colors & patterns of fabric

- Any hair color besides red, orange, or brown

Georgene Pattern

- Button eyes
- Wide faces

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Zigzag Eyelashes

- Distinct zig-zag eyes embroidered under eyes

- No buttons

- Wide smiles

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
